

CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE
March 7, 1944

This Committee called attention of the Advisory Council and the Administrative personnel, as a whole, for constructive effort in order to expedite restoration of normalcy to this Center. The Committee's effort to restore normalcy has not only been retarded, it appears that the opposition is again assuming active part by calling the attention of the newly-arrived Manzanites.

1. In order to confuse new arrivals, as well as the whole center colonists, so-called various publication has been distributed publicly which, we note, is due to the lack of disciplinary measure on the part of the Administration.
2. The vandalism in the public school which occurred some time on Saturday or Sunday night may be a prelude, which is definitely noted as the plot to renew confusion.
3. Colonists are beginning to regard the work of the Co-ordinating Committee with eyes of suspicion. This is because for the past three weeks no release was made and the colonists are beginning to lose faith in the campaign of justifiable releases which this Committee previously made public. The Administration is evidently trying to make generous release; that is the reason why release in the past has been retarded, but among the colonists such rumor is prevalent that the Committee is ignoring the release movement purposely. Such rumors are being spread by few of those who have been regarded by the colonists as respectable people.
4. The problem of employment is neglected; one example is the problem of Motor Pool employees (former). These ex-employees have repeatedly blamed this Committee for the reason that they have not been recalled to work. Daily several ex-employees would approach us with complaints for which we have been bothered that we cannot do more important work.
