Dear Brother-Miller:

Well we are still trying to recuperate, and trying to get settled down. The let-down from the furious packing was bad. No regular work but still trying to get settled takes a lot of time. In the meantime we eat three meals a day. Perhaps it may not be to everybody's liking but as a whole it is all right so far. The first day was bad. Children also need special food, but not so far. Scouts and boys clubs are being worked out. Religious services on Sundays attract nearly 2000 people. Biggest crowd for a religious service but not in proportion to the population. The army drafts people for various camp work. No school(regular) as yet. Community toilet, mess hall, showers, and a busy community laundry. You must wait a dozen deep before you get your at the wash. Quite a job. Well, it isn't so bad after all. The nipping of creative endeavor will be the worst evil. Thanks again for all you have done.
