

Dear Mr. Naohara:

In reply to your letter of January 20, regarding your reinduction to Jerome, I can only assist you in this way. If your remaining at the camp is due to an illness caused by your kidneys, I will approve reinduction if such illness is determined to exist by the Project medical staff.

If the Project medical staff does not agree that your illness is of sufficient importance to require your remaining at the Project, then you would have to be reinducted without approval from this office, which would mean that you would have to have approval from the Director in Washington, D. C. before going out on future leave. In either case, whether you are inducted without our approval or with the approval of this office and the medical staff of the Project, you will forfeit your right to take indefinite leave to any of the six northern counties of Utah. This ruling is in accordance with a memorandum issued by H. Rex Lee, August 21, 1943, closing the counties mentioned to permanent relocation from the Projects.
