

Postcard from K. Meguro to Mr. and Mrs. F. Takano, August 17, 1942

Fumio and Yoneko,

Are you doing well?

We got up at 5:00AM in the morning on Monday. Getting ready for the departure, we gathered at 7:00AM. After the inspection of our luggage, we got out the gate and walked more than a mile to get on the train. It was at 9:10AM when we left Pomona where we have been settled. Ben and Masako are leaving later. Somewhat I felt attached to the Pomona camp and sad about leaving. We will be far apart from you, but do not worry. Get along well and do well. I wrote this in the train. I will write again on the way. I pray that we will arrive safely in Wyoming.
