TO: Those Wishing to Change their Answers to Questions 27
and 28.

The following steps are required to change your answers in line with Administrative Instruction No. 22, Revised, Supplement 12.

1. The Army alone can change answers on the questionnaires. The W.R.A. has a responsibility for granting or rejecting leave. In the case where answers are "no," the Federal Bureau of Investigation returns those questionnaires to the W.R.A. for further investigation. Before leave of any kind is issued, the national W.R.A. returns this file to the Project Director. After interviews by a board and recommendations, the file of all material is returned by the Project Director to the National Director of the W.R.A. who alone has the authority to issue leave to any person whose file has been returned.

HOW TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR INDEFINITE LEAVE IF YOU
ANSWERED "NO" TO QUESTIONS 27 AND 28

1. Write a letter to Mr. L. H. Bennett, Project Director giving the reasons for your "no" answer in detail.

2. Give the reasons why you wish to change to "Yes."

You will then be given an interview by a board who will question you in detail. You should bring with you five references in regard to your work and attitudes here at the center. This Board has no authority to issue leave, but only to ascertain the facts in reference to your situation. This is a serious matter. The Board is charged with the responsibility for a thorough consideration of your case.

Bring all pertinent material with you for your interview. Know all the facts. Have your dates well in mind and finally, do not expect an immediate answer. As stated above, all material will be sent to Washington and will have to be referred to the Army before any changes are permitted. All leaves will depend upon Mr. Dillon S. Myer, National Director of the W.R.A.
