Dear Sir:

We understand that you are arranging storage facilities for evacuees' properties at government expense.

If the above is true, we should like to offer our Japanese Social Hall located at 326 Center Street, Turlock, California, as a government storage place for properties of Turlock district's evacuating people. It has quite a large facility.

Naturally since our normal operating expenses have run into the neighborhood of \$400. per annum (which includes taxes, water, insurance, etc.), we would like to get some income to defray these expenses.

If we cannot arrange the taking over the Social Hall as a storage place by the government, we shall have to find some other means of deriving income to offset the natural expenses that accrue in the maintenance of this hall.

If you are interested in the above proposition, please let me know immediately so we may discuss it more in detail. Thank you for your kind attention.
