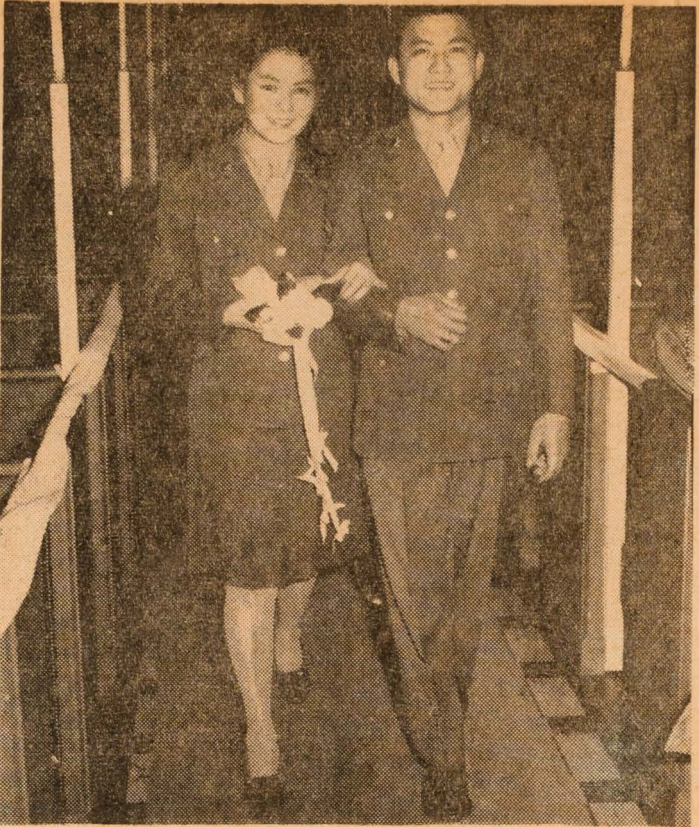


## IN FORT CEREMONY—

"My experience with AWOLs is very limited because in the year we trained before we went overseas there were just two cases in our entire outfit that I know of. One of the boys who went AWOL did so because his name was stricken off a list of men alerted for overseas duty. He became disgusted because he wanted to get overseas. Two men supposedly AWOL from our outfit overseas after being released from a hospital and ordered to a rest camp, were found fighting on the front lines, having hitch hiked there without notifying the proper authorities they had returned."
