Dear Golly, Please read carefully.

Please forgive me for not writing sooner. I arrived safely in Fort Meade and on time. Had a nice time during my stay with Neesen and Neesen.

Please take this form and take to the Red Cross in Colver and have them help you fill out this dependency allotment Form 620. I am taking this means so Dad, Mom, Dottie will have a little income from my pay.

You are over 18 so you are no longer dependent on me. But Dad, Mom, Dottie are dependent on me, so I'd like Dad, Mom, Dottie to have some sort of income. The Red cross knows how to fill out this form. It is necessary that you do this soon as possible.

Have a duplicate copy of Dottie's birth certificate made at Mc Lee. (ask the Red cross personnel where a duplicate copy could be obtained,) and enclose the certificate and this form into in an envelope and send it to "Office of Dependency Benefits 213 Washington Street, Newark 2, New Jersey

→ Put my name, rank (Pvt.) and serial number on back of Dottie's birth certificate.

The Red cross personnel will act as witness.
