Leghorn Italy

Dear Dad,

I've received yours of July 20th. I'm glad to hear that everyone is in best of health. As for me I'm also in best of health so don't worry about me.

I am at Leghorn now and our job is to guard prisoners in stockade and guard them while they work at the salvage yard. About a mile south of here is the dock where ships come in from the States bringing in food rations and after the ships are empty they load salvage materials and head back. Sometimes I see troop ships come in and load troops who's heading back to the States for reassignment. Hope the day soon ^{come}

when I'll be going back.
The weather is always fine
here at Leghorn. I've been
here for over a week now
and had perfect weather
all along. Sometimes in
the afternoon it gets
awfully hot so we go
swimming ~~in~~ at the beach
which is not more than
two blocks away.

I imagine the Bonadisi
will be on pretty soon.
I sure wish I could be there
to visit.

This will be all for
now until again. My regards
to everyone.
