It had never been the policy of our Government to force our beliefs and teachings on anyone, hence, these two school systems were set up by the groups themselves, with a certain amount of supervision by the official Chief of the Educational Division, who also attempted to render what ever assistance was possible.

Then there was the American "Federal" Grammar School and "Federal" High School. This was staffed with teachers who met the Texas requirements and they became accredited schools in the State of Texas.

The children who chose to attend here were taught American principals, ideals and way of life, just as in thousands of schools all over the U. A. A.
