Programs for the Baccalaureate Services to be held at the Christian Church on June 4, have already been made out, although the speakers have not as yet been named.

At the Senior Banquet to be held on June 6, Dr. Powell will be the main speaker. The menu will include a chicken dinner.

A Senior Tea honoring the mothers of the Seniors will be held on the afternoon of the Baccalaureate Services.

Aileen Oita, Valedictorian, Kouichi Tanaka - Salutatorian. That's the lineup of this year's Senior Class top honors. Corky will have the opportunity to greet all the spectators at the Commencement and Aileen will have the final word.

The procedure which was responsible for these choices was as follows:

1. The senior council was asked to recommend a basis for choice. They recommended that scholarship be basic, followed by service leadership, character and speaking ability.

2. The faculty accepted this with the exception that speaking ability was held out and was not used as there was no need for it.

3. The six seniors ranking highest were picked by a decimal system.

4. The six were given a rating of 3-2-1 in leadership, service, character by all those faculty members who felt competent to grade.

5. These ratings were added to their scholarship rating multiplied by 3.

Aileen Oita had the highest total with Corky Tanaka next. This gave scholarship a weight of 2; to 1 for leadership, character, and service.

SCHOOL NAME TO CHANGE

At a meeting held yesterday in Room 14 representatives of the Community Council, Student Body Council, Senior Council, Faculty and the P.T.A. met to consider the change of the school name. A motion was passed that the school shall change its name. Since classes pins have been ordered with Poston II High School on them, the new name of the school will not take effect until July 1. The new name will be selected by a body of the aforementioned organizations and presented to the student body for final vote.
