

NISEI ENEMY GETS JAIL TERM

WALNUT GROVE—The courts, from the smallest to the highest, "must uphold the laws of our country," Justice of the Peace Milo E. Dye declared today as he sentenced Mrs. Wilma Insigne, alias "Kitty Ferguson," to ninety days in the Sacramento County jail for disturbing the peace of a returning Japanese American family.

It was the first jail sentence ordered for the threatening of Japanese Americans who now are being permitted to come back to the west coast from War Relocation Authority (WRA) centers.

Sixty days of the sentence was suspended provided that Mrs. Insigne leaves the county for one year after she serve thirty days.

The complaint was filed by Army Pvt. Yoshio Matsuoka, who spent ten months in a German prison camp and recently met his family at a Colorado relocation center. He stated that Mrs. Insigne threatened to have his father's home burned down if the family remained in Walnut Grove.
