WARRANT

TO THE CHIEF OF INTERNAL SECURITY OF THE TULE LAKE RELOCATION CENTER:

A complaint, on oath, having been filed with me wherein it is alleged that the above named defendant did, on or about the ~~10th~~ day of March, 1943, refuse to obey the instructions of the Project Director of the Tule Lake Relocation Center in that said Project Director had issued a directive that all persons of Japanese ancestry residing within said Project should register, but that the said defendant failed, neglected, and refused to register in accordance with said directive; and,

It appearing to me that said defendant should be forthwith apprehended to answer the allegations in said complaint:

NOW THEREFORE you are commanded to forthwith arrest the said defendant, Ray Ishibashi, and bring him before me, without delay, in order to answer the allegations of said complaint, and to be dealt with according to law.
