accuses Harold S. Jacoby, Chief of Internal Security
of violating War Relocation

Authority regulations in the following form and manner:

That on or about the _____ day of _____, 1943, at
and in the Tule Lake War Relocation Center in the State of California, the
above named defendant, _____ 10th March, did refuse to
obey the instructions of the Ray Ishibashi Project Director of the Tule Lake War Reloca-
tion Center in that said Project Director had issued a directive that all
persons of Japanese ancestry residing within said Project should register,
but that the said defendant failed, neglected and refused to register in
accordance with said directive.

All of which is contrary to the form, force and effect of said
regulations in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dig-
nity of the War Relocation Authority, an agency of the United States of
America.

WHEREFORE, said complaint prays that a warrant may be issued for
the arrest of said defendant, in order that he may be dealt with accord-
ing to law.
