Housing facilities, including running hot and cold water, beds and mattresses, cooking utensils and plenty of fuel, are arranged and employment is guaranteed from mid-April to December, it was added. Tom Oki, formerly of Palo Alto, is also assisting the 2 men in securing workers.

The wages for the cannery work are 60 cents per hour, while the following government wage scale set by the Department of Agriculture for the preliminary sugar beet work will be paid; \$12 per acre, thinnin; 3.50 per acro, first hoeing; and \$2.50 per acre, second hoeing, For sugar beet topping, the scale is \$1.35 per ton, with usually an 18-ton yield per acre. This scale is higher than that of last year, which was 31.10 per ton.
