"Developing World Citizens in a Japanese Relocation Center," an article written by Miss Wenda Robertson, principal of the Topaz elementary schools, appeared in this month's Childhood Education magazine.

Supplemented by photographs, the article tells the adjustments that grade school children had to make living in a center.

Miss Robertson also discusses how community-wide co-operation and the wide use of environment contributed to better living. "The sincerity and determination of the teachers, many of whom have had no training, deserve much credit," she states.

The close relationships between the school and the community is stressed throughout the article.

### Topaz Rams Beat Delta

### HOUSE REPEALS CHINESE EXCLUSION

The House voted last week to repeal the 61 year old Chinese Exclusion Act and permit immigration of 105 Chinese annually on a quota basis. The action was taken on a voice vote.

The legislation also amends naturalization laws to permit Chinese to become citizens. The bill now goes to the Senate, it was stated.

Arrangements have been made for the use of the high school auditorium this Thursday and Friday nights when Dr. E. Stanley Jones, noted evangelist, will speak to the residents.

Dr. Jones, a member of the national preaching mission and one of the world's greatest evangelists, is expected to arrive Thursday afternoon.

The reception honoring members of the preaching mission on Thursday will begin from 3:30 PM instead of at 3 PM as previously scheduled, Rev. J. Tsukamoto reported today.

## NISEI SOLDIERS LEAD INVASION

American soldiers of Japanese ancestry led the Italian mainland attack of a famous American division which had distinguished itself in Tunisia, Secretary of War Stimson revealed to the press last week end.

Stimson said that the nisei had passed the test of Nazi fire with flying colors and now are "fighting in the battle lines along the road to Rome".

They form the 100th infantry battalion. All were born in Hawaii of Japanese parents.

## CANADIAN JAPANESE: 27% FROM COAST AREA RELOCATED

VANCOUVER, B.C.--More than 27% of the persons of Japanese origin evacuated from Pacific Coast areas have been relocated east of British Columbia, according to George Collins, commissioner of Japanese placement.

Of the 21,300 expelled from the defense zone, a total of 5,786 have moved east of the Rockies. Relocation provinces include Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario and Quebec.

British Columbia's remaining Japanese population is estimated to be about 17,000, of whom about 10,000 are evacuees located in government-supervised housing settlements.

## 1212 TOPAZANS GET EDC CLEARANCES

Eastern Defense Command clearances have been granted to 1212 Topaz residents, as of October 11.

Of this number, 47 had relocated to the far eastern states for employment and 24 for student relocation by October 18.
