MOST TOPAZANS DO NOT PLAN COAST RESTRICTION QUERIES ANSWERED BY BARNHART

Possibilities of many Topaz residents returning to the West Coast immediately appeared slight judging by the number of applications, which have thus far been made at the relocation office.

To date only 34 residents have indicated to the relocation office their intentions of leaving for California between now and June. Six persons left this week for the coast state on short term leave to investigate feasibility of returning to their former homes.

As the second family to leave for California since the lifting of the exclusion ban on Wednesday will be Mrs. Sumiye Sugimoto and her sister, Keiko Adachi, of 5-12-B. They will leave tomorrow for Redwood City where they will reside. Mrs. Sugimoto has a husband and a brother in the US Army.

CONFERENCE PROJECT DIRECTOR TO FLY TO S.F.

Project Director L. T. Hoffman is planning to fly to San Francisco tomorrow to attend informal conferences with WRA Director Dillon S. Myer and Assistant Director Robert B. Cozzens in connection with the reopening of the West Coast to evacuees.

Wednesday through Friday he will attend meetings called by the Pacific Coast Committee on American Principles and Fair Play. He will go to Los Angeles Saturday to talk with officials of the WRA there, and will be back in Topaz on January 19.

ISHIDA WOUNDED ON FRENCH FRONT

Pvt. Masaru Ishida, 22, was wounded in action on December 13 on the French front, according to a wire received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Arata Shin Ishida of 29-6-AB, from the War Department on January 2. He is attached to the 442nd Infantry.

He reported for active duty last June and received his basic training in Camp Shelby, Miss., and was sent overseas in October. He is a former resident of Atherton, Calif.

He has four brothers in the service, 1st Lt. Hira-ku of the Medical Corps now overseas in France; Pfc. Sonau, also in France; Pvt. Sodatsu, en route to Ft. Meade, Maryland, and Pvt. Mochiu in the reserves.

5 Men Called For Induction

Five men will report for induction January 9, according to Leighton Dingley of the local board 30.

Those reporting are: Yasumasa Furuya, 30-4-AB; Peter Goro Kitagawa, 36-4-CD; Motoki Yatabe, 11-10-A; Hideo Yoshida, 13-3-AB; and Harry Nakao, 33-5-F.

were issued by Ralph C. Barnhart, former project attorney here. Attorney Barnhart is now in Topaz from Washington as special representative of WRA Director Dillon S. Myer.

Q--Are there any curfew regulations for aliens?

A--Public Proclamation No. 21 revoked all curfew regulations.

Q--Are there any prohibited districts in the Western Defense Command area?

A--No. There are no excluded areas on the West Coast for either citizens or aliens except such posted areas around military installations which apply to everyone.

Q--What are the limitations on local movements of aliens, say between adjacent towns like from San Mateo to San Francisco or Berkeley to San Francisco? Is the five-mile travel limitation that existed at the time of evacuation for citizens and aliens of Japanese ancestry still in effect?

A--The five-mile limitation now applies only to aliens and is effective throughout the United States. Aliens must notify the US District Attorney and receive permission to travel beyond that distance from their homes. In cases of regular travel; as between home and work, they can obtain monthly travel passes. These are Department of Justice regulations and are subject to change.

Q--What are the specifics of contraband for aliens?

A--Executive Order No. 2525 regarding contraband for aliens of any country with which this country is at war are still in effect as heretofore. There are no contraband regulations for American citizens of (Continued on page 2)

N.Y.C. OFFERS EXCELLENT JOBS AND OPPORTUNITIES

New York City is pictured as an area in which some of the 60,000 evacuees in centers may settle and find excellent jobs and business opportunities and a not unfriendly population, the New York Times reported.

This conclusion was reached by WRA from a report made on the basis of interviews with 30 of 100 Japanese who had conducted successful businesses or held jobs in New York City since Pearl Harbor Day.

The report is intended to "sell" evacuees on the virtues of settling in New York and copies will be distributed to residents of relocation centers.

Commenting on the attitude of New Yorkers toward Japanese business men, the report said:

"A marked lack of discrimination, even during the period shortly after the outbreak of war, was reported by the Japanese business people who were interviewed. This is especially noteworthy because many of them are engaged in consumer industries or service trades in which the bulk of their business is with Caucasians.

"The Japanese consulted here not only said they believed the New York district to be a good place for issei evacuees to open new businesses, but offered to advise and otherwise aid newcomers in getting started.

"They invite correspondence from center residents who are thinking of relocating to New York area and going into business."

Japanese ancestry. Proclamation 2525 provides that no alien enemy shall have in his possession, custody or control at any time or place any of the following articles: firearms, weapons or implements of war, ammunition, bombs, explosives or material used in their manufacture, short-wave radio receiving sets, transmitting sets, signal devices; codes or ciphers, cameras, papers, documents or books in which there may be invisible writing, photograph, drawing or map of any military or naval installations or implements of war used by the United States armed forces.

NATIONAL JACL OPENS OFFICES IN SAN FRANCISCO

With the lifting of the ban for all loyal persons of Japanese ancestry by the Western Defense Command, the National JACL will open its offices in San Francisco, California, today.

Miss Teiko Ishida, the acting national secretary who had been in charge of the New York City office will supervise. She already has her army clearance and is in San Francisco to make the necessary arrangement.

The main job of the San Francisco office is to carry on the educational campaign to bring about a better understanding of the evacuation and the position of persons of Japanese ancestry in this country. The JACL job will be to supplement the work of the Caucasian friends on the Pacific Coast.

Also when the staff is completed, assistance will be given to evacuees in their problems of readjustment upon their return to the Bay region.

YANO CITED FOR BRAVERY IN ITALY

Corporal Frank H. Yano, son of Mr. and Mrs. Yano of 31-7-CD, was recently awarded the Bronze Star for heroic achievement in action with Lieutenant General Mark W. Clark's Fifth Army in Italy. Corporal Yano was formerly from San Francisco, California.

Yano, who serves in a medical detachment with the 34th "Red Bull" Infantry Division on the Fifth Army front, won his decoration by driving his jeep to points immediately behind the front line to evacuate seriously wounded men. Although the area was continually shelled by the enemy, Yano repeatedly went to rescue casualties.

STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR RELO GRANTS

Students are now eligible for relocation assistance grants on the same basis as other residents provided it is a final relocation. WRA Director Dillon S. Myer informed the center yesterday.

They will not be eligible to return to a center, however, if grants are provided, he said.

The Spanish Embassy as protesting power of the Japanese nationals has requested the WRA, through the US State Department, to list Japanese nationals in relocation centers.

The WRA administration has also been requested to list next of kin residing in Japan of nationals in the centers. Since the WRA files do not contain this information each national is asked to supply it.

Forms have been prepared for each national to write in the names of next of kin and will be distributed by the block managers. The listing of kins is voluntary. If nationals do not wish to supply this information they may answer the forms by writing in "None", "not available" or some such phrase.

It is requested that the forms be returned to the block managers within three days after their receipt.

"We urge the people of our community of our churches to respect the constitutional rights of these people and to give evidence of the spirit of tolerance and understanding as we work together for a better world, a world of liberty and justice for all."
