Q -- Are there any curfew regulations for aliens?

A--Public Proclamation No. 21 revoked all curfew regulations.

Q -- Are there any prohibited districts in Western Defense Command area?

A--No. There are no excluded areas on the West Coast for either citizens or aliens except such posted areas around military installations which apply to everyone.

Q -- What are the limitations on local movements of aliens, say between adjacent towns like from San Mateo to San Francisco or Berkeley to San Francisco? Is the five-mile limitation that existed at citizens and aliens of Japanese ancestry still effect?

A -- The five-mile limitation now applies only to is effective aliens and the DottinU" throughout States. Aliens must notify the US District Attorney and receive permission to travel beyond that distance from their homes. In cases of regular travel; as between, home and work, they can obtain monthly travel passes. These are Department of Justice regulations and are subject change.

Q -- What are the specifics of contraband for aliens?

A -- Executive Order No. 2525 regarding contraband for aliens of any country with which this country is at war are still in effect as deretofore. There are no contraband regulations
