#### SHOTS FIRED ON RETURNEES

FRESNO, May 9-Two shots were fired here late last night at the home of Setsugo Sakamoto, 61-yearold Japanese resident and father-in-law of two servicemen.

Sakamoto, a court interpreter for many years prior to evacuation, reported the police that he heard a car pass at approximately 10:30 PM when the shots were fired.

Police, upon a routine investigation, discovered two .38 caliber bullets embedded in the house, but were unable to determine who fired them.

They said that Sakamoto had been active in civic state laws and constitu- affairs for many years and had returned to his Fresno home from internment camp about a month ago, His two daughters are married to servicemen-one, a Caucasian.

Special plans will always be made for the relocation of the sick and infirm so that they will suffer no ill effects from the trip. Nurses will be provided as in the case of the seven Topaz hospital patients, who left last week for the San Francisco hospital with nurse Paul Martin.

One of the patients, Ka-kuji Tamura, has written back to the Topaz hospital:
