VOLUNTEERS LEAVE CITY FOR U.S. ARMY

With the termination of recruiting procedures Saturday, a group of accepted enlistees left Topaz yesterday afternoon, on the anniversary of the Pearl Harbor attack, for the Military Intelligence Service Language School at Camp Savage, Minn. The nisei volunteers will first be processed at Fort Snelling in Minneapolis. With the group will be Sgt. Tsutomu Kumagai, who escorted the Tule Lake recruits to the language school prior to his arrival here.

The new training period is expected to open on Dec. 15, with completion in 6 months; after which the trainees will be assigned to other Army activities, or will be maintained as instructors in the school.

With the nisei recruiting party, which left Topaz Saturday for the Granada Relocation Project to conduct a similar mission, was a Caucasian processing unit. This detail, which has the sole authority to recruit nisei from the evacuation centers, included Capt. Jerry P. Tobin, Sgt. Robert E. Green, Sgt. Charles Ford and Pvt. Melvin L. McGrath.

Recruiting officer 1st Lt. Roy M. Hirano reported that the enlistment here was encouraging, although the response was greatest at Tule Lake center.

While in Topaz, Technical Sgt. Ichiro Nishida, one of the recruiting personnel, was notified of his promotion to Master Sergeant since December 1.

NO PASSES FOR CHILDREN TO BE ISSUED

According to Project Director Charles F. Ernst, no passes into Topaz or into other localities in Millard County from the City will be issued to children under 15 years of age until further notice. This temporary step has been deemed necessary by the administration as a precautionary health measure against the current increase of measles and mumps cases in Millard County.

A survey made last week showed that in Topaz alone 4 cases of mumps and 2 of measles have been reported.

School children are asked for the time being to keep away from Block 29. It is also requested that where parents observe children showing a swelling of face or neck, or a rash on the face or the body, they should keep the children home indoors and call a physician. Parents are asked not to bring such children to the Clinic.

From Monday, Dec. 7, the Medical Clinic will be open only in the afternoons on weekdays from 2 to 4 PM and on Saturdays from 10 to 12 AM, Dr. W.S. Ramsey announced today. Emergencies will be handled at any time.

Besides the daily general medical and surgical clinic, special clinics will be held on the following days by appointment: Monday, Well-Babies; Tuesday, Pre-natal and Cardiac; Wednesday, Diabetics; Thursday, Pre-natal and Chest; Friday, Venereal disease; and Saturday, Post Partum.
