FOUR MEDICAL CENTERS
ARE ESTABLISHED
IN POSTON

Medical Staff Announces List
Of District Dispensaries

Effective today, the Poston Medical Staff will establish district dispensaries in four key sections of the city. All calls for medical aid should be directed to these area medical centers which will take care of designated blocks. The Dispensaries will act as first aid stations and, where necessary, summon the doctors in charge. On duty during the daily dispensary office hours (8:30-11 a.m.; 2-4 p.m.) will be a nurse, doctor's assistant (who will be on night duty) and a doctor.

Areas established are:

Sec. 1--Includes Blocks 37, 38, 39, 42, 43, 44, 53, 54, 59, 60. Dispensary address: Blk 43, Apt. 1A. From June 1 to June 14 (up to 8 a.m. June 15) Dr. Sumida (Blk 11, 2D), will be in charge.

Sec. 2--Includes Blocks 5, 6, 11, 12, 21, 22, 26, 27, 28, Dispensary address, Blk 22, Apt. 10A, Dr. Murakami (Blk. 11 2A), medical officer in charge.

Sec. 3--Includes Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 13, 14, 15, 16. Dispensary address: Blk. 13, Apt. 1A, Dr. Kasuga (Blk 11, 2D), officer in charge.

Sec. 4--Includes Blocks 17, 18, 19, 30, 31, 32, 35, 36, 45, 46. Dispensary address: Blk. 31 Apt. 1A, Dr. Kawaichi in charge.
