

Nisei Loyalty Told As Hawaii Newspaper Calls For Statehood

HONOLULU, T. H. — The month since that unforgettable Star Bulletin, leading Hawaiian daily, called for statehood for the Territory of Hawaii in an editorial on Feb. 25, declaring that the "one basic objection to the admission of Hawaii as the state of the Union had been answered by the proven loyalty of Americans of Japanese ancestry."

The Star-Bulletin said that the objection to Hawaii's statehood "was the large number of citizens of Japanese ancestry in Hawaii and the fear that our election and our government would be 'Japanized' were Hawaii to become a state."

"And deep below this was the doubt and the speculation in some quarters as to what these American citizens of Japanese ancestry would do in a crisis, the Star Bulletin observed."

"Well the crisis came," the newspaper said. "It came on December 7, 1941, amid the roar of the smokes of war planes and the deaths of Pearl Harbor."

"It came in the days and weeks following, when Hawaii's defense, shockingly stripped, lay open for another attack—and when, if ever, that attack might be from saboteurs within."

"The answer to the skeptics, the doubters, the speculators, and sincerely believed that 'once a Jap, always a Jap' has come, with clarity and significance, every day and week and week."

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WRM Denies Plan To Unite Enemy Families

TULE LAKE. — The Federal Department of Justice and the War Relocation Authority have no plans for uniting with their families Japanese who have been apprehended as dangerous alien enemies and removed from the Tule Lake center to alien internment camps under the jurisdiction of the Department.

Charles Rothstein, special assistant to the attorney general in charge of the Department of Justice said at New Haven any reports that such a plan is to be brought about are based on misinformation. Rothstein, who was telephoned by the attorney general's office in Washington, D. C., said the situation of the Japanese American community is unchanged by this regard.

Rothstein said: "The Department of Justice has no plans to bring about reunions in the Tule Lake camp or elsewhere. The men removed have been placed in internment camps under more strict control because they were engaged in subversive activities. The Geneva Convention does not specify for such internees the right to have their families with them."

In a similar statement Director Best added: "So far as the WRA is concerned, reunions are not possible in the Tule Lake or any other center, even if interned men should be paroled."

Headstones were toppled from the graves, while the door of the mausoleum was battered in, unsuccessful attempts to gain entry, Peter Burdoff, sexton, reported.
