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Oregon's Alien Land Law "Of Doubtful Constitutionality" Says WRA Solicitor

WASHINGTON. — That two sections of Oregon's new Alien Land Law "are of very doubtful constitutionality" was the opinion expressed this week in an analysis of the law prepared by the WRA Solicitor's office in Washington.

"The new Oregon law... does not change the prohibitions of the Alien Land Law of 1921, but merely provides that they are not dependent on the crop produced. Where the alien manages the operations on behalf of the owner, the agreements should be supplemented by accurate and complete records. To show that he is actually an agent and not a shareholder, tenor or operator, he should have his accounts, sales receipts and expense statements that clearly reflect this to be the case."

If an alien evacuee wishes to return to Oregon as a farm laborer, or to live and work or manage land owned by his children or other citizens, there is no reason why he should not do so, Mr. Ferguson said. He should

HERO OF A HORATIO ALGER STORY LAIN IN CHICAGO

CHICAGO. — Ryo Kay Kasaba, formerly of Nishimura, is the hero of a Horatio Alger story laid in Chicago.

Kay came to Chicago two years ago to work as a machinist in the men whose cars the 20-year-old Kay took care of seemed especially appreciative and one day asked Kay if he'd like to work for a company making radio condensers. Kay appeared at the man's office on the day after his arrival and was soon given an application. In the interview that followed Kay told his new friend that he was Japanese American.

"You don't say so. Why, I thought you were Filipinos! Stand up and let me look at you. To my knowledge, you're the first Japanese I've ever seen," the man said.

They talked a while longer, and then Kay was asked, "How would you like to start at sixty cents an hour?"

"Sure," said Kay. In two weeks, he was raised to seventy-five cents per hour, and a few weeks later, he was making eighty cents per hour. Kay had worked with radio condensers for a little more than a year now. His wage is \$1.20 per hour and he supervises forty girls. The employer is so pleased with Kay that he has employed additional Nisei. As a foreman at the age of twenty-two will forty workers under him, Kay Kada feels he is not doing bad.

7 Bay Region Nisei Recent Casualties In Northern Italy.

SAN FRANCISCO. — Seven former Bay Region Japanese Americans were recent casualties in Northern Italy. Two were killed: Sgt. Tom Sagimori, Berkeley, and Pfc. Roy Ikeda of San Francisco. Sagimori, a University of California graduate, was serving in a combat engineer unit which had fought in the Japanese American task force distinguished the Presidential Unit citation for rescuing the now famous "Lost Battalion" near Bruyeres France, last November. The wounded: Pfc. Tom H. Kimura and Pfc. George T. Matsuda, both of San Francisco; Pfc. Kenzo Takahashi, San Mateo; Pfc. Shigeru Yamamoto, Hayward; and Sgt. Minoru Moto of San Leandro. All served with the 442nd Infantry Regiment, 10th U.S. Infantry Division, under General Jacob L. Devers. Sixth Army group in Germany, was awarded the Bronze Star for heroic achievement in evacuating the wounded under artillery fire.
