MORE TULEANS TO DEPART

Department of Justice notices were being served today to an unannounced number of male residents of this center, instructing them to report Saturday for entrainment to an alien enemy internment camp, according to the WRA.

The men, most of whom renounced their U. S. citizenship recently, were instructed to have their baggage ready at their homes by 8 a.m. tomorrow.

TULE LAKE FARM

ONLY CAMP TO MAINTAIN ACTIVE FARM PLAN-REED

Tule Lake will be the only center maintaining an active agricultural program this year, according to E. H. Reed, head of WRA's agricultural section in Washington D.C., who left here Tuesday night for Minidoka Relocation Center after a four-day stay.

No farm programs have been outlined for the remaining centers, except Gila and Poston where only crops that can be harvested before July 1 will be planted; all other centers will dispose of their livestock six weeks to two months prior to the date of closing.

For this center, Reed this week recommended to Dillon Myer, national WRA director, the raising and slaughtering of 4900 hogs (975,000 pounds) for the current year. Original plans called for the pro-

NOTICE TO PROSPECTIVE REPATRIATES RECEIVED

An important State Department notice to all persons who have requested repatriation was received here this week from National WRA Director Dillon Myer in connection with a third exchange of U. S. and Japanese nationals, to which Japan recently agreed to negotiate.

The State Department notice is directed specifically to persons who have asked repatriation but who have changed their minds and to persons who still desire repatriation but whose present addresses may be unknown to the State Department and to the Spanish Embassy in Washington.

The lack of such information may cause serious complications in the exchange negotiations, the State Department stated. Therefore, all persons affected by this notice should immediately notify the Special War Problems Division of the State Department and the Spanish Embassy of their decision. This also applies to persons who have left or intend to leave the center.

Following is the official State Department notice:

NOTICE TO PERSONS WITH OUTSTANDING REQUESTS FOR REPATRIATION:

The attention of persons who have been designated by the Japanese Government for repatriation or who have signified a desire to travel to Japan in an exchange of nationals between the U. S. and the Japanese Government, is invited to the necessity of keeping the Department of State (Special War Problem) (cont'd on page 2)

EQUAL TREATMENT ASSURED STUDENTS

Equality of opportunity to all students of Japanese ancestry was guaranteed last week by President Robert Sproul in a message issued to The California Bruin, campus paper.

President Sproul's statement said in part:

"The University makes no distinction among students because of their race, religion, or nationality. Therefore, persons of Japanese ancestry who have been cleared by the War Department and other federal authorities and who return to California either to begin or to resume their studies at the University will not be treated differently from other former students or applicants for admission..."

4 CHARGED WITH ASSAULT AND ARSON IN DOI CASE

Following investigation by authorities of two "terror raids" on the ranch property of Sumio Doi near Auburn, Calif., Jan. 18 and 19, four men are held in the Placer County jail charged with assault and arson, and four young women are held as material witnesses, reported the San Francisco WRA Offices, Tuesday.

Bail was set for each of the men at \$5000 cash or \$10,000 bond. The four women, reported to have

been on drinking parties with the men when the incidents occurred, have been released on their own recognizance.

The WRA Regional Office stated that Auburn citizens cooperated in the investigation by the Department of Justice, military police, the sheriff's office, and the district attorney's office which led to the arrest and filing of charges.

lems Division) and the Spanish Embassy at Washington fully informed of all changes of address after leaving a relocation center. Notice of repatriation is likely to be short, and if an address is not available to the Department of State when repatriation is agreed upon the telegram notifying the individual to prepare himself for repatriation may not be delivered, causing him or her to miss the opportunity.

Individuals whose wishes regarding repatriation change should likewise bear in mind that it is essential promptly to notify both the Spanish Embassy and the Department of State regarding this circumstance. If such notification is not given, an individual who desires repatriation may find himself deprived of the opportunity even though he has priority for accommodation on the exchange vessel, whereas, another individual who no longer wishes to be repatriated may suddenly be summoned to New York for that purpose. This is a serious matter. Furthermore, negligence of individuals in informing the authorities of changes of intention or of changes of address may cause serious complications in the exchange negotiations.

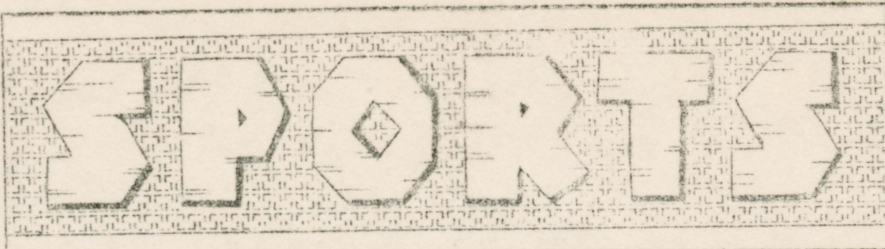
BROWNIE HOSPITAL TO CLASH SUNDAY
