The WRA this week reported two new incidents in a campaign of terrorism against returned Japanese Americans in California.

The new incidents were in addition to 15 shooting attacks, one attempted dynamiting, three arson cases and five threatening

News was received from the Northwest this week of two families formerly of Tule Lake.

The Sakaguchi brothers and their wives--Mr. and Mrs. Taki Sakaguchi and Mr. and Mrs. Takaeishi Sakaguchi--reported themselves finding life satisfactory in their home near Bellevue, Wash. They have been able to buy a tractor and a Caucasian neighbor has loaned them a horse to cultivate their cauliflower plants.

Sidney Sato and his three sisters are also back on their 150-acre dairy farm in the beautiful Snoqualmie Valley near Carnation, Wash., having moved from Weiser, Ida., where they first settled after leaving Tule Lake.

The Satos--the sisters are Yoshiko, Yoko and Mits--have 60 dairy cows, and Sidney is a member of the Seattle Milk Shippers Association.

visits which Secretary of Interior Harold Ickes said had taken place in California in the past four months.

One of the new acts of terrorism took place in Fresno, Calif., at the home of Setsuro Sakamoto, 61, who was an adopted son now fighting with the U.S. Army in the Philippines, and a son-in-law in the Army at Fort Snelling, Minn.

Sakamoto and another son-in-law, James Collier, and Mrs. Collier were at home the night of May 8 when someone approached and fired three revolver shots, the WRA said.

The other incident took place in Talbert, Orange County, Calif., where a group of men have been calling on returned evacuees and telling them to leave. On May 4, according to the WRA, they called on Mary Masuda, who was staying with a family named Trudeauaux, and told her to get out. Four of her brothers have been in the service. One, Kazuo, was killed at Cassino. Another, Takashi, was wounded while fighting with the 442nd Regiment in France. A third brother Masao, is now on route to Talbert on furlough. And the fourth, Mits, has been medically discharged.

Monthly sugar allotment in project mess halls has been reduced from two pounds per person to 1 1/4 pounds per individual in accordance with the OPA (Office of Price Administration) order, effective since May 1, Raymond Hayward, chief project steward, disclosed this week.

This cut in sugar quota applies to all centers as well as the continental U. S.

The OPA has also hiked the point value of lard from 6 to 10 points per pound, stated Hayward.

NEW STEPS ASSIST HOUSE HUNTERS

Extraordinary measures to assist resettling evacuees in finding housing have been outlined by Rex Lee, WRA Relocation chief, who recently visited Tule Lake Center.

A WRA staff member, Lee said, will be assigned in most of the large Relocation Division field offices with the specific responsibility of organizing community efforts to provide housing for resettling evacuees.

Other principal steps to be taken will include establishment of clearing houses for housing information, improvement of temporary housing accommodations to take care of resettlers pending finding of permanent quarters, and closer examination of all phases of public housing programs and of FHA privately financed building programs.

"Primary responsibility for finding housing for his family still rests with the resettler," Lee said. However, WRA offices will spare no effort to better co-ordinate the efforts of all groups working on housing and to make as much information as possible available to the home-hunting relocatee."

CHAMPIONSHIP BOUTS CROWN TWO TITLISTS

Fighting before a capacity crowd of over 1000 fans, the championship boxing matches held Tuesday night at the local pavilion crowned two center ring titlists. Aki Hada of Block 20 is the new lightweight king, and the new bantamweight title-holder is Walt Yoshikawa of Block 19.

In the main event, Hiroshi Yokota and Hide Imamura fought to a draw, and Angel Kagiya and Yosh Hada semi-windup bout was declared a no-decision match by the judges.

Aggressive Aki Hada clinched the lightweight

crown by outpointing Jimmie Nakawatase in a fast four-rounder. Starting off cautiously Hada bored in to score-telling left hooks and right crosses to the body while Nakawatase countered with left jabs to the head. The bout ended with both sides exchanging stiff blows; Hada weighed in at 134 pounds and Nakawatase at 140 pounds.

By side-stepping most of the hard blows thrown by charging Jimmie Nakayama and by landing strong counter-punches, crafty Walt Yoshikawa gained a close decision to cop the bantamweight crown. Nakayama at 118 pounds carried the fight all the way, slugging toe to toe to worry Yoshikawa, who tipped the scale at 120 pounds.

The main event saw Hiroshi Yokota, 143-pound substitute for Shima Miyamoto, go four rounds to draw with heavier Hide Imamura, who hit the scale at 150 pounds. Looking for openings, Yokota and Imamura got off to a slow start feeling each other out.

In the second round, Imamura let loose with a barrage of punches initiating the slugfest. Yokota gained a slight edge in the third by catching Imamura with his quick left jabs to the face, and Imamura evened the count in the fourth by connecting with terrific punches to the body and head.

Both respecting the other's hitting power, Yosh Hada, 122-pound featherweight, and southpaw Angel Kagiya, weighing 128 pounds fought to a draw in the semi-windup. Following a closely-matched first and second rounds, Kagiya landed sharp left hooks to the face of aggressive Hada to spirit a short rally. Hada came back strong in (cont'd on page 6)

TAIYOS BOUNCE SEINEN DAN, 7-2, DURING WEEK SASANO HURLS 3-HIT GAME

In a postponed hickory contest Tuesday afternoon Taiyos, behind a brilliant three-hit hurling of Hiro Sasano, bounced the Seinen Dan to the tune of 7 to 2. Taiyos managed to make their hits pay dividend; a direct contrast to their performance against the Wakabas a week ago, when they ripped off seven blows but could not push across a single run.

Sasano yielded two hits in the second stanza and one in the fourth, chucking shutout ball the rest of the way. In these two frames, Seinen Dan boys capitalized on their hits, collecting their two digits. Centerfielder Larry Hoshiko kinked out to right and brought in Hank Ogawa, who got on base on a double to left, for the initial score. Strangely enough these two players were responsible for the final tally; Hoshiko again pelted the pill to right, this time a beautiful tri-

ple, enabling Ogawa to tally.

Taiyos went on a batting spree in their third chucker, getting four hits and four runs. Hot corner artist Jimmie Daijogo started the ball rolling when he got on first by pounding out a base hit to left. Successive singles by Red Tanaka, Boe Kataoka and Jimmie Enkoji accounted for three of the tallies, while the fourth came when Seinen Dan Shortstop, Jimmie Honda, erred on ball hit be slabster Sasano.

In the opening inning, Enkoji spiked rubber on a fielder's choice, while Taiyos final counters were fashioned in the seventh canto on Sasano's bingle and an error registered by right fielder Yosh Uyeoka.
