## 36 LEAVE TULE LAKE CENTER IN MAY; 81 SINCE JANUARY

Thirty-six persons left Tule Lake Center during May to return to their former homes or to make new homes and engage in new endeavors, the Administration announced today. Ten more people had made definite plans to leave by the fifth of June, which will bring the total of Tule Lake resettlers since Jan. 1 to 81 by the end of this week.

Tuleans leaving during May went to many parts of the U. S., including many sections of the Pacific Coast. The farthest traveler headed for Boston, Mass., with several stops for visiting scheduled on the way.

**ST. LOUIS PAPER****PROCEDURE STREAMLINED****LISTS 8 TULEANS****CHANGES AID RESETTLEMENT  
OF PAROLED ENEMY ALIENS**

Activities of eight former Tuleans were chronicled in the last issue of The St. Louis Nisei, publication of the Nisei Coordinating Council of St. Louis, Mo.

At a Hawaiian night festival on the fifth floor of the YWCA, Joe Fujioka contributed "hot piano solos" and Florence Abe was featured as a torch singer. The committee in charge of the event included five former Tuleans, with Miss Abe as chairman. The others are Pauline Miyagawa, Susie and Ted Tamaki, and Miyoko Mano.

Two former Tuleans are listed in the rosters of the two St. Louis dentistry schools, Paul Fujioka as a freshman at the St. Louis University School of Dentistry and Hiroshi Kanegawa as a sophomore at the Washington University School of Dentistry.

Changes of procedure designed to aid resettlement of paroled enemy aliens have been made by the Immigration and Naturalization Service with one of the principal features of the streamlined procedure being approval of travel applications as promptly as possible, the WRA has been advised.

Parolees' applications will be handled on an individual basis, each alien

being responsible for following completely the terms of the instructions issued by the Immigration and Naturalization Service. To avoid delay in individual cases, a temporary sponsor who is a public official but not a member of the Immigration and Naturalization Service may be designated at the parolee's resettlement destination.

**NURSERY SCHOOLS  
TO BE REMODELED**

An approval to remodel and improve five nursery schools of this center was received from the Washington office this week, Homer Ricketts, senior engineer, stated today.

Inner walls will be lined with plaster boards, floors will be covered with mastic-pave, and additional lighting will be installed in all schools.

In addition to all these improvements, school zones will be fenced to safeguard the children, Ricketts said.

**MORE SENTENCED  
FOR VIOLATION  
OF REGULATIONS**

Fathers of boys charged with violating the Special Project Regulations were involved in three recent hearings before Harry Black, project hearing officer.

Keishiro Tateyama was sentenced to 90 days in the project jail when found guilty of violating Special Project Regulation No. 8, which states that any parent who knowingly permits any minor child under the age of 16 to violate the regulations is guilty of an offense.

Kenichi Yamasaki was sentenced to 120 days in jail which was suspended. Yamasaki was placed on probation to supervise the activities of his son.

Action of the hearing officer was withheld for the time being in the case of two fathers and six boys who agreed to cease violations.

In addition, Masaki Nishi was sentenced to 180

days in the project jail; Keichi Ikeda was sentenced to 240 days with 120 days suspended under probation; and Takeshi Imagawa was given a 250-day suspended sentence. The three were sentenced in connection with charges of violating the Special Project Regulations.

Kichijiro Tsuji was sentenced to 90 days in the project jail, with 60 days of the sentence suspended, when found guilty of assault.
