Rev. Tanabe Attacks Skeptic Attitude Of Dai-nisei

SAN ANSELMO, July 1-Urging the delegates to become followers of Jesus Christ, the Rev. S. Tanabe, young people's director of the San Francisco Japanese M. E. church, delivered a challenging ad-dress at the third annual retreat of the Northern California YPCC

on Sunday morning.

The Rev. Tanabe, who was in charge of the model young people's church, drew vivid illustrations in his ringing message to describe the changing attitude among the second generation church-goers.
Skepticism and indifference so common among the nisei young people were especially scored by this youthful pastor.

"Christianity is well suited to Japanese and Christianity can gain something from Japan as it did from other nations of the world." Such was the gist of an address delivered by Prof. John E. Wishart, who spoke on "History of the Church." Wilbur Takiguchi introduced the speaker.

Why the Concert?

In this materialistic world of ours there is a definite need for the life of the spirit. We do not live by bread alone! And if we start to live merely for the material profits alone, life becomes an unending tread-mill of sordid futility. No person is, indeed, complete without the depth of the spiritual side of life.

We have definitely entered into the long-talked about Nisei Era, and the niseis are rapidly taking their places in life. How important it is that each Nisei has a strong conviction, rooted in the faith of a great Power, which will withstand all temptations and defeats. The Northern California Young Peoples Christian Conference movement was first organized in 1926 by young Nisei leaders with the great help of the late Rev. S. Kato, and, since then, has grown into an organization which enters into the life of many hundreds of niseis. The purpose of this noble movement has been "to unite spiritual forces, to strengthen local organizations, to cultivate Christian leadership, and to forward the realization of a deeper Christ-like living."

Now in this year of 1937, there is evident a profound need of a greater push forward, and we have adopted a new philosophy of continuous Christian work throughout the year rather than merely laying a stress on the conferences which occur only at intervals. But this great push is held back because of the lack of funds due to the drain on the treasury during the recent depression years.
