Warling,

Thanks a million for the cigarettes and your letters written on the 9th and 22nd. It really is grand hearing from you my dear.

Gee how I hope that Aileen's cold is much better and am glad to hear that the thermometer accident wasn't serious.

Well my finger is still plenty sore but I guess everything will be alright soon again. I didn't go to see the doc today but I guess I'd better go tomorrow.

Dearest please don't send me anything for awhile. If you should get a chance to get me a pair of shoes do so and if you haven't sent it as yet please don't. Now please don't send me anything any more and use the money for something

that will be of more value to yourself and Aileen.

Well this place isn't so bad except that it is hot during the day time and it gets kinda chilly and cold at nite. The dust around here is really something and as long as we are going to be here just a couple of months everything will be okay.

Last nite I wrote a letter to my sister and Frank. I guess it was about time I wrote to Frank cause I haven't written to him in a long long time. Frank sure does miss his wife and son. Incidentally how is Wayne? Bet he is chubby like his dad no doubt. In his picture he sure looks chubby and he favors his dad. Sure hope that Frank will soon get well so that he can enjoy playing with Wayne.

requested me to take, well I
guess it will be out of the
question for awhile cause I
didn't have one taken in
Rome. I don't know when I'll
ever go to Florence again but
I'll send you one in the near

future if I don't come home by then. I have the money to have a picture taken but since we are located so far away from Florence that I don't feel like going there.

Gee hon I knew a fella by the name of Kimura who took the Infantry training with me last year. I heard that he either got killed or wounded very seriously with the 10th Mt. Div. He was a 7/4 and was a nice fella. I've met a lot of fellas that we trained and they went to the front. The majority of them fellas are now dead or are badly wounded. They really must of had it plenty rough when they made the big push up here just before the war ended. In a way I should of consider myself lucky for getting a job as training the men for Infantry.

3/ Well how if our outfit comes home than I'll be stationed somewhere in the state cause I haven't got enough points to be discharged.

Dearest I am going to close for to nite but will write you soon again. Please take the best care of yourself and Aileen. Love and miss you both with all my heart dear. Good night Darling.
