

Taiyo-Nippons Meet Thursday in Second Grid Game of Season

GEORGE ISHIHARA, coach and business manager of the Taiyo Athletic Club, must have been writing letters to "Pop" Warner. He has been drilling his team in a lot of trick plays to pull on the Nippon Athletic Club when the two Japanese rivals meet Thanksgiving morning at 11 o'clock in the new Auditorium Stadium, in the second of their two-game series.
