JESUS ON WEALTH | Luke Dahlenburg

Bible reading: Matthew 6:19-24

The world is an attractive place, and that's no mistake—God made it that way. Enjoying creation is good, but how we relate to wealth reveals our hearts. Too often, we thank God for what we have but then focus on building our own kingdoms, giving God only our leftovers.

Three Challenges from Jesus

1. Two Treasures: Earth or Heaven?

- i. Earthly treasures decay, break, or get stolen.
- ii. Heavenly treasures are eternal-investing in God's kingdom.
- iii. What we treasure directs our hearts and priorities.

2. Two Conditions: Light or Darkness?

- i. Our eyes shape our vision of life—healthy eyes focus on God's generosity. See 1 John 1:5
- ii. Unhealthy eyes (greed, jealousy) distort our priorities.
- iii. Fixing our gaze on God.

3. Two Masters: God or Money?

- i. Money = Mammon. Not just cash. What we look to for security, identity, and joy.
- ii. Serving God means trusting Him, enjoying Him and investing in His eternal kingdom.
