The Great Man (Job 1:1-5)

Job truly fears God and is righteous.

What kind of book is Job?

- a. Wisdom literature.
- b. Proverbs & Song of Songs → How life usually works. Patterns & order.
- c. Job & Ecclesiastes → Yes... But. Exceptions to the rules.

What is Job about?

- a. Innocent suffering, 1:9; 1:22

Who is Job?

- a. The greatest man = Living the model life of one of God's people, 1:1-5

The Great Accusation (Job 1:6-12)

The accuser claims Job only follows God for what he gets.

The Great Loss (Job 1:13-2:10)

Job loses everything yet still trusts God's wisdom and rule.

- a. Instant → while [each messenger] was still speaking.
- b. Complete → The only one who has escaped to tell you.
- c. Varied → Wind, fire, construction failure, theft, and murder. All supports gone.
- d. Response → Worship = Bow down before a leader. Submitting himself to God.
- e. Response → Integrity = Chose not to rupture his character or curse God.
