They have just come up from being washed. Each of your teeth has its twin. Not one of them is alone. ³ Your lips are like a bright red ribbon. Your mouth is so lovely. Your cheeks behind your veil are like the halves of a pomegranate. ⁴ Your neck is strong and beautiful like the tower of David. That tower is built with rows of stones.
