Genesis 1:26-28 (New International Reader's Version)

²⁶ Then God said, "Let us make human beings so that they are like us. Let them rule over the fish in the seas and the birds in the sky. Let them rule over the livestock and all the wild animals. And let them rule over all the creatures that move along the ground."

²⁷ So God created human beings in his own likeness.
He created them to be like himself.
He created them as male and female.

²⁸ God blessed them. He said to them, "Have children so that there will be many of you. Fill the earth and bring it under your control. Rule over the fish in the seas and the birds in the sky. Rule over every living creature that moves along the ground."

v18	godlessness	(noun)	the characteristic of thinking and acting without consideration of God
v18	wickedness	(noun)	evil; sinfulness; thoughts and behaviour that is against what God wants
v18	suppress the truth	(phrase)	hide the truth; prevent other people from learning to truth
v19	plain	(adjective)	obvious; clear
v20	'the creation of the world'		the time when the world was made
v20	invisible	(adjective)	unable to be seen
v20	qualities	(noun)	characteristics
v20	eternal	(adjective)	everlasting; unending
v20	divine	(adjective)	belonging to God
v20	clearly	(adjective)	obviously
v20	excuse	(noun)	a reason given for why something was (or was not) done
v21	glorified	(verb)	worshipped; praised
v21	futile	(adjective)	pointless; has no chance of succeeding
v21	foolish	(adjective)	opposite of wise; showing poor judgment
v22	fools	(noun)	people who show poor judgment; people who are not wise
v23	exchanged	(verb)	swapped; replaced with something else

Romans 1:18-23 (New International Reader's Version)

¹⁸ God shows his anger from heaven. It is against all the godless and evil things people do. They are so evil that they say no to the truth. ¹⁹ The truth about God is plain to them. God has made it plain. ²⁰ Ever since the world was created it has been possible to see the qualities of God that are not seen. I'm talking about his eternal power and about the fact that he is God. Those things can be seen in what he has made. So people have no excuse for what they do.

²¹ They knew God. But they didn't honor him as God. They didn't thank him. Their thinking became worthless. Their foolish hearts became dark. ²² They claimed to be wise. But they made fools of themselves. ²³ They would rather have statues of gods than the glorious God who lives forever. Their statues of gods are made to look like people, birds, animals and reptiles.

v28 – called	(verb)	summoned by God to belong to him
v28 – according to	(adjective)	agreeing with; consistent with
v29 – foreknew	(verb)	knew beforehand
v29 – predestined	(verb)	have been decided beforehand for a particular outcome
v29 – conformed	(verb)	made like another
v29 – likeness	(noun)	being alike; having the same appearance, behaviours etc
v29 – firstborn	(noun)	the eldest child
v30 – justified	(verb)	declared righteous; said to be right and acceptable
v30 – glorified	(verb)	made magnificent

Romans 8:28-30 (New International Reader's Version)

²⁸ We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him. He appointed them to be saved in keeping with his purpose. ²⁹ God planned that those he had chosen would become like his Son. In that way, Christ will be the first and most honoured among many brothers and sisters. ³⁰ And those God has planned for, he has also appointed to be saved. Those he has appointed, he has made right with himself. To those he has made right with himself, he has given his glory.
