**Luke 12:32-34 (New International Reader's Version)**

<sup>32</sup>“Little flock, do not be afraid. Your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. <sup>33</sup>Sell what you own. Give to those who are poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out. Store up riches in heaven that will never be used up. There, no thief can come near it. There, no moth can destroy it. <sup>34</sup>Your heart will be where your riches are.

v11 – content	(adjective)	satisfied
v12 – ‘in want’		in need; not having everything that you need for basic living
v15 – ‘acquaintance with’		knowledge of
v15 – gospel	(noun)	the good news that people can be in right relationship with God through trusting in Jesus.
v16 – aid	(noun)	practical help and assistance for someone in trouble
v17 – desire	(verb)	strongly want
v18 – amply	(adverb)	more than sufficiently; generously
v18 – fragrant	(adjective)	pleasant-smelling
v18 – sacrifice	(noun)	something that was burnt on the altar to offer it to God as an act of worship
v19 – glory	(noun)	greatness, beauty, majesty

**Philippians 4:10-21 (New International Reader's Version)**

<sup>10</sup>At last you are concerned about me again. That makes me very happy. We belong to the Lord. I know that you were concerned. But you had no chance to show it. <sup>11</sup>I'm not saying this because I need anything. I have learned to be content no matter what happens to me. <sup>12</sup>I know what it's like not to have what I need. I also know what it's like to have more than I need. I have learned the secret of being content no matter what happens. I am content whether I am well fed or hungry. I am content whether I have more than enough or not enough. <sup>13</sup>I can do all this by the power of Christ. He gives me strength.

<sup>14</sup>But it was good of you to share in my troubles. <sup>15</sup>And you believers at Philippi know what happened when I left Macedonia. Not one church helped me in the matter of giving and receiving. You were the only one that did. That was in the early days when you first heard the good news. <sup>16</sup>Even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me help when I needed it. And you did it more than once. <sup>17</sup>It is not that I want your gifts. What I really want is what is best for you. <sup>18</sup>I have received my full pay and have more than enough. I have everything I need. That's because Epaphroditus brought me the gifts you sent. They are a sweet-smelling offering. They are a gift that God accepts. He is pleased with it. <sup>19</sup>My God will meet all your needs. He will meet them in keeping with his wonderful riches. These riches come to you because you belong to Christ Jesus.

v17 – command	(verb)	tell someone they must do something
v17 – arrogant	(adjective)	proud
v17 – wealth	(noun)	the possession of a large amount of money, property or other valuable things
v18 – deeds	(noun)	actions
v18 – generous	(adjective)	gives more of something (especially money) to others than expected
v19 – treasure	(noun)	a collection of valuable objects
v19 – foundation	(noun)	the basis for something ; the base layer of a building on which the rest of the building is built

**1 Timothy 6:17-19 New International Reader's Version (NIRV)**

<sup>17</sup>Command people who are rich in this world not to be proud. Tell them not to put their hope in riches. Wealth is so uncertain. Command those who are rich to put their hope in God. He richly provides us with everything to enjoy. <sup>18</sup>Command the rich to do what is good. Tell them to be rich in doing good things. They must give freely. They must be willing to share. <sup>19</sup>In this way, they will store up true riches for themselves. It will provide a firm basis for the next life. Then they will take hold of the life that really is life.
