Bible reading: Titus 1:1-9 (Page 1699)

2 Tim 3:16 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, 17 so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

verses 6-9 characteristics of a church leader

verse 6: blameless, faithful to his wife, a man whose children believe and are not open to the charge of being wild and disobedient.

verse 7: blameless - not overbearing, not quick-tempered, not given to drunkenness, not violent, not pursuing dishonest gain.

verse 8: hospitable, one who loves what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy and disciplined.

verse 9: hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it.

2 brief reflections on the 15 characteristics of a church leader:

i. In church leadership, personal character and conviction come before ministry competence

ii. GOD sets very high standards for church leaders

Titus 2:11 For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. ¹² It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, ¹³ while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, ¹⁴ who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good.
