**"Exodus"** = a going out; a departure or emigration, usually of a large number of people (Dictionary.com)

## 1. In the beginning ... (Genesis 1-50)

Gen 12:1 The LORD had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. 2 "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

Gen 46:2 And God spoke to Israel in a vision at night and said, "Jacob! Jacob!" "Here I am," he replied. 3 "I am God, the God of your father," he said. "Do not be afraid to go down to Egypt, for I will make you into a great nation there. 4 I will go down to Egypt with you, and I will surely bring you back again. And Joseph's own hand will close your eyes."

## 2. "A new King, to whom Joseph meant nothing ..." (Ex 1:1-22)

Gen 1:28 God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it ..."

Ex 12:40 Now the length of time the Israelite people lived in Egypt was 430 years.

Ex 12:37 The Israelites journeyed from Rameses to Sukkoth. There were about six hundred thousand men on foot, besides women and children.

- servitude (vv8-14)
- genocide (vv15-22)
- "the midwives feared God and did not do what the King of Egypt told them to do" (v17)
- Q. Can anything hinder God's promise to bless Abraham and his descendants?

### 3. Unto us a child is born ... (Ex 2:1-10)

- "basket" (Ex 2:3) = "ark" (Gen 6:14)
- from a Hebrew baby boy sentenced to death, to a Prince of Egypt
