Great Prayers in the Bible ...

23/11	David's prayer (after a cancelled building project)	2 Sam 7:1-29
30/11	Solomon's prayer (at the opening of the Temple)	2 Chr 6:12-42
7/12	Daniel's prayer (after the Temple has been destroyed)	Dan 9:1-19
14/12	Ezra's prayer (after the Temple has been rebuilt)	Ezra 9:1-15

4/1	Jesus' prayer for us	Jn 17

Acts 1:7 He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. 8 *But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.*"

1. Peter and John are persecuted for witnessing to Jesus (vv1-22)

- "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved" (v12)

- "courage" (v13)

2. The disciples pray in response (vv23-31)

Q. What would you have prayed in this situation?

Everything is taking place exactly according to God's plan:

i. God is the creator of all things

ii. God is the great promise-maker and promise-keeper

- "anointed one" = Messiah

- "in vain" (Ps 2) = futile, useless, hollow, without results

Acts 4:29 Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. 30 Stretch out your hand to heal and perform signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus."

i. v29 is a prayer for boldness in the face of expected ongoing opposition

- "boldness" (v29) = "courage" (v13)

ii. v30 is a prayer for God to keep drawing attention to Jesus

- 2 immediate answers:

i. "the place where they were meeting was shaken"

ii. "all were filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly"

- "boldly" (v31) = "boldness" (v29) = "courage" (v13)

So what, for us?

i. "They did what your power and will had decided beforehand should happen"

- God's sovereignty and our responsibility

- the cross of Christ

ii. "Consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness"
